SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT February 28, 2021 PASTOR'S CORNER

By the time this reflection is read, the Catholic Men's Conference will have occurred, virtually this year due to the realities of the world we face, but it will have occurred and my hope and prayer is that all who attend are able to have their spiritual batteries recharged. We see this also happening in the Gospel when Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up the mountain and they witness the Transfiguration. A moment so special in the lives of the evangelists that it is one of the extremely few events in the life that is recorded in all 4 Gospels.

When we participate in events like the Catholic Men's Conference, or any other event that speaks to soul in such a way that we want to stay in that moment for as long as we possibly can. The apostles speak to this when they want to erect tents for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah so they can stay on the mountain and be part of something so much grander and so much grander than they possibly could have ever dreamed. They DON'T want to leave the mountain.

But...Jesus reminds us that while it was a good and special thing to be up on that mountain top...ultimately, we must descend that mountain and take what we experienced into the world. It is in this step that we often feel disoriented and where we struggle. If we could just stay up on that mountain top all would be right in our world. But that is not where we live...and while those moments can charge our spiritual batteries; ultimately to have any meaning or merit we must take that experience into our day-to-day lives where we try and connect others to that mountain top.

This is where our faith become less personal, in the sense that it is all about us, but where the 'rubber meets the road' and where we take the graces we have received and actively promote these graces to other people so they too may feel that intimate connection with Jesus in their lives. We struggle with this because we think faith is a personal thing, held close to the vest and certainly not something that we would want to share beyond our immediate circle of comfort. Jesus reminds us that we need to change our perspective and to focus more outward than inward, to know that hoarding any of those close and personal experiences with Christ is missing the point. We need to take the highs of those moments into the world in many shapes and forms...and realize that those moments may seem mundane to us are actually on the 'mountain top' for others. Our faith is not meant to be bottled up...our faith is meant to be shared with everyone we meet. I hope everyone continues to have a "Happy" Lent and continues to stay warm, stay safe.

The DMI survey was developed by the Catholic Leadership Institute in conjunction with advising US bishops and Catholic lay leaders in 2013. The DMI Survey was created as a tool to help more Catholics to grow along their faith journey with Christ and to become more engaged in the community life of the parish. The DMI Survey seeks to provide parishioners an opportunity to reflect on their spiritual growth as well as provide parish leadership with invaluable insights regarding a parish's strengths and opportunities.

By St. Mary participating in this survey, the results will provide meaningful input about our parish as we begin our own planning process as part of Real Presence Real Future. The information from the DMI Survey will give insight into our priorities and into the allocation and realignment of resources over the next few years as our parish strives to more effectively help parishioners along their personal journey of faith.

YOU ARE MY BELOVED CHILD

Reflection on Mark 9:2-10

The transfiguration of Jesus in today's Gospel is closely linked to His Baptism in the Jordan by John. On both occasions the sky speaks those words of generative love: "This is my beloved Son..."

At Jesus' Baptism, Mark reports that the proclamation, "This is my beloved Son," is followed by "with you I am well pleased." Each of us hear those same words spoken to us personally at Baptism, when we begin the lifelong journey of faith. At every stage of that journey, in every moment, we are embraced as daughters and sons who are beloved of God, and with whom God is pleased. This reality, this status of belonging in a royal, holy household, is not earned, but pure gift. God delights in you, His son, His daughter, just as you are.

Whenever I hear this transfiguration story, where God follows those words of generative love with the command, "Listen to him," I am reminded of the last recorded words of Mary, the beloved Mother of Jesus, in the Gospel: "Do whatever he tells you." (from the wedding feast at Cana).

Listen to Him, and Do whatever He tells you. This journey of faith is a story that is the Word of God told throughout human history. It is told in the lives of our ancestors, and written by God with our lives as well. Listening to His Word, and doing what He instructs us to do, involves a daily and sometimes hourly choice to act in this world, to act in all our relationships, as if it were true that God is love, despite any and all evidence to the contrary.

SAINT KATHARINE DREXEL

Feast Day: March 3 • Patron Saint of Philanthropy & Racial Justice



Born in Philadelphia in 1858, she had an excellent education and traveled widely. As a rich girl, Katharine also had a grand debut into society. But when she nursed her stepmother through a three-year terminal illness, she saw that all the Drexel money could not buy safety from pain or death, and her life took a profound turn.

Katharine had always been interested in the plight of the Indians (Native

Americans), having been appalled by what she read in Helen Hunt Jackson's *A Century of Dishonor.* While on a European tour, she met Pope Leo XIII and asked him to send more missionaries to Wyoming for her friend Bishop James O'Connor. The pope replied, "Why don't you become a missionary?" His answer shocked her into considering new possibilities.

Back home, Katharine visited the Dakotas, met the Sioux leader Red Cloud and began her systematic aid to Indian missions.

After three and a half years of training, Mother Drexel and her first band of nuns – Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored – opened a boarding school in Santa Fe. A string of foundations followed. By 1942, she had a system of black Catholic schools in 13 states, plus 40 mission centers and 23 rural schools. Segregationists harassed her work, even burning a school in Pennsylvania. In all, she established 50 missions for Indians in 16 states.
